## TREASURY ANNOUNCES NEW MARKETS TAX CREDITS ALLOCATION AWARDS

On May 23, 2019, the United States Department of Treasury's Community Development Institutions Fund ("CDFI Fund") announced the awardees of New Markets Tax Credits ("NMTC") for the 2018 round of the NMTC program. The Treasury awarded a total of \$3.5 billion of NMTC to 73 community development entities ("CDEs") for this round, selected from a pool of 214 applicants.

## **BRIEF SUMMARY OF THE NMTC PROGRAM**

The NMTC program is a tax credit program that promotes investment in businesses and public facilities located in low-income communities. In exchange for a qualified equity investment in a CDE, an investor becomes eligible to receive tax credits from the federal government. The CDE then provides a loan or an equity investment to a qualified active low-income community business ("QALICB") that is located in a qualified low-income census tract or that provides services or employment opportunities to "targeted populations" composed of lowincome individuals. Some examples of projects financed with the assistance of NMTC include community centers, charter schools, medical facilities, child care facilities, historic live theater venues, supermarkets, business incubator facilities, shopping centers, office buildings for public agency use, clean technology research facilities, manufacturing plants, mixed-use projects, hotels, public libraries, office parks serving nonprofit organizations, and affordable housing.

To date, over \$57.5 billion in NMTC have been utilized to stimulate investment in lowincome communities since the NMTC program's inception in 2002.
